# A Letter From the LRAV Director



Dear Friend...

In 1912, the City of Little Rock dedicated \$500 for a impound facility at City Hall to hold the stray/unwanted animals. Today we have a 2.2 million dollar, state-of-art facility and are continually looking at plans to add to or improve our building. This facility (the Animal Village) is designed to allow for the best possible care of the city's unwanted/stray animals and, along with an enforcement of the animal laws, we are far beyond not just anything else in the state, but most others in the country. Our work with the Little Rock Police Department has resulted in felony convictions for animal cruelty. All of our efforts are not only about people following the animal laws or picking up the stray animals, but are, by design, to educate the public that ownership of an animal is a privilege (like having another member of the family) and to find homes for all that come through our doors.

Trying to put something of this caliber together has been difficult, and showing that you can make a difference in the day-to-day grind of what many consider a no-win situation is often times heartwarming and depressing on the same day. We continue to make improvements each and every year and have made positive contact with citizens (both two- and four-legged), which lead to meaningful enhancements in care to the animals of our city.

The list of accomplishments of LRAV is perpetually growing. Records continue to fall each year and as soon as we break an old record, we look to the future at the next record to fall. It has been challenging to do this year after year, and we continuously look at what we can improve to keep the momentum. I have actually looked at amazement of what we had just accomplished and wondered how we will top that one. We are proud to say in the last four years, 9,427 animals have been adopted, transferred to Rescue Groups, sent to Northern homes under PetSmart Charities "Rescue Waggin' Program," or returned to their owner. That's just short of 10,000 animals whose lives we have constructively touched.

A few years ago, it was a dream for a group to take over the public awareness/fundraising side of the Village, and then, all of a sudden, here comes Friends of the Animal Village. Knowing it would take some time to get the group up and running, we planned to continue operating in the same manner with fundraisers and awareness campaigns until the time when we could turn it all over. Well, that time is now, and I'm proud of the efforts of FAV! They've had great success the past three years with Doggie Paddle Day at War Memorial Fitness Center, raising thousands of dollars, promoting of our facility, and just being fun. At the first Santa Paws, the Animal Village was presented a \$100,000 check to build a quarantine area for the animals waiting to go to rescue—a BIG surprise. Just in the last month, sponsoring programs for micro-chipping animals has culminated in 80 animals being chipped. This will result in a quick return to the family if Animal Services finds a one of these lost pets. Adoption events, new partnerships, and working with television stations and print media brought new attention to our efforts.

As I'm now able to turn over the awareness efforts to FAV, my new goals and hopes are to keep up with the undertakings of this great group of dedicated citizens. Expansions of the Village are currently being developed and new ways to help our animals are being examined. I am forever grateful to FAV for making our city the best it can be for our four-legged citizens, and I will continue to improve on what has been created. To keep this going we need the support of this wonderful group.

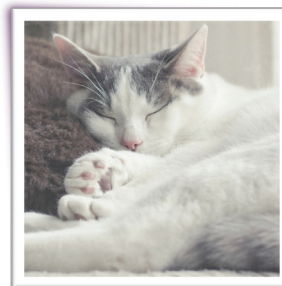
## This Year at a Glance

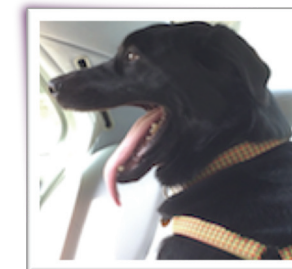

Looking through this year's Annual Report, we hope that you gain a better understanding of who we are, what we do, and the impact we have on people and animals alike in Little Rock.

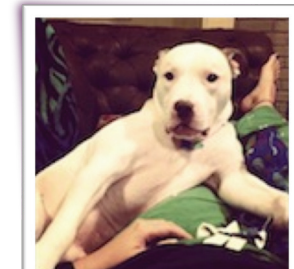

# Our Main Goal: More Adoptions, More Lives Saved

## Adopt, Don't Shop!

Most people would agree that pets provide us with joy and unconditional love, but few people know that there are actual health benefits correlated with owning a pet. The American Heart Association states that owning a pet, especially a dog, can help lower people's risk of heart disease. Similarly, the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention reports that pet owners tend to have lower cholesterol levels. Pets provide companionship and help to ease loneliness, often promoting activity and social interactions with others. The simple act of snuggling with a furry friend can help to lower blood pressure and increase levels of serotonin and dopamine, thereby reducing stress, anxiety, and depression. Children who grow up with pets are less likely to suffer from allergies and asthma, and many learn responsibility and compassion from taking care of pets.

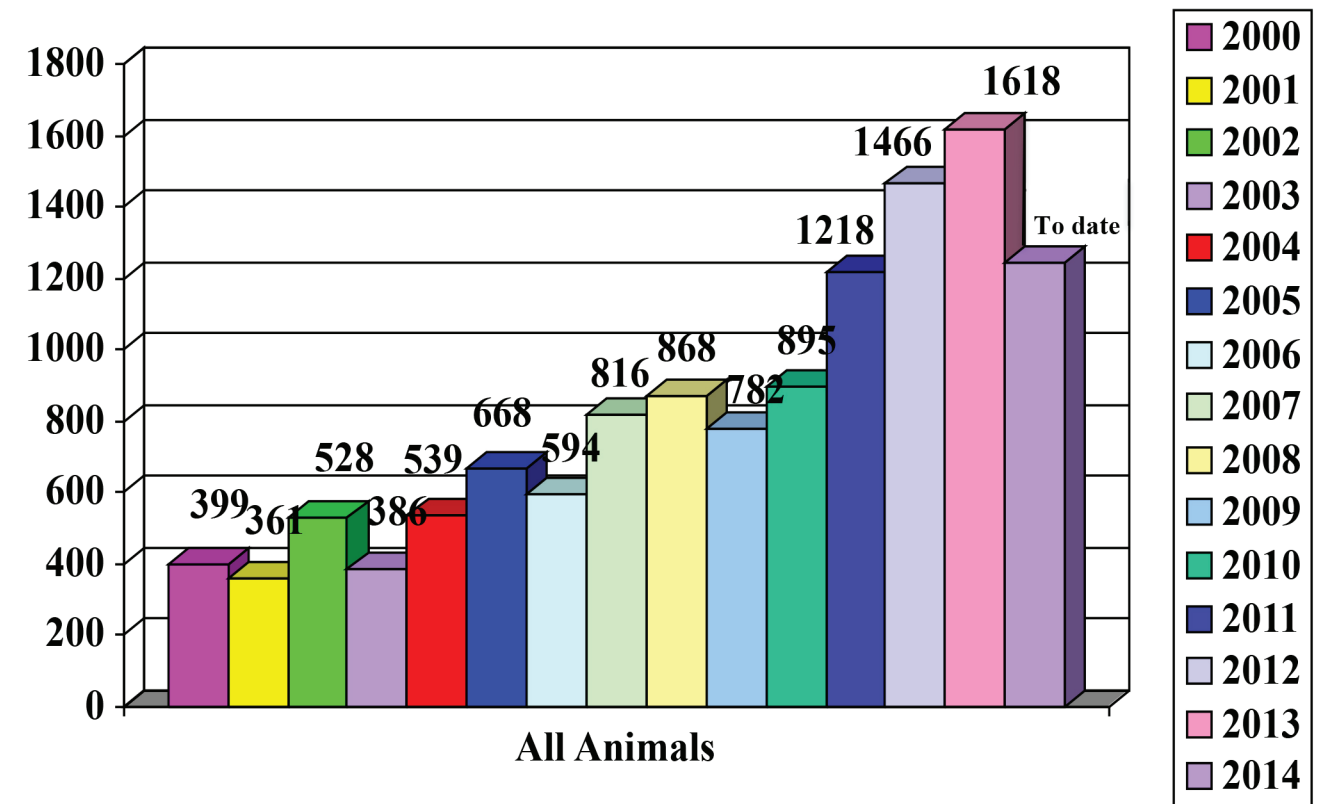


There are many important advantages to adopting from a local animal shelter like our fabulous Little Rock Animal Village! The first and most important is that when you adopt, you will save the lives of two animals—the one that you take home, as well as the one that can now be rescued because of the space you helped free up in the shelter! Additionally, adopting a pet from LRAV is much less expensive than buying a pet from a breeder. LRAV's \$90 adoption fee includes all initial veterinary expenses, such as first vaccinations and sterilization (see page 12 for more details). By adopting instead of buying a pet, you ensure that you are not supporting puppy mills (aka: factory-style breeding facilities), which will continue to operate as long as people keep purchasing pets from them.



When selecting a pet, make sure to take into consideration your lifestyle, as well as your general activity level to ensure that you end up with the pet that's best for you! Consider the amount of activity you engage in—both indoors and outdoors—as well as if there are children, elderly folks, or other animals living in your home. One of the most important things to keep in mind is how much time you have to devote to a cat or dog. All pets require time and attention, but some will require more than others.

## Purple Collar Club

- This year, we launched the Purple Collar Club, a program designed to highlight the shelter's older residents that are looking for their forever homes. # Events



## Santa Paws

Friends of the Animal Village organized its very first holiday event this past year, which took place on Saturday, December 12, 2013 at the *Oxford American* annex space on Main Street. Santa Paws was a huge success—it introduced FAV to many new, animal-loving members of our community.

Tickets were sold to Santa Paws for about a month leading up to the big day, and cost \$30 apiece. For this ticket price, our guests enjoyed a silent auction, featuring items from many well-known artists and sponsors, as well as festive music, butlered bites, and a scrumptious dessert spread courtesy of Sweet Love Bakes. They were also treated to complimentary beer—provided in-kind by Stone's Throw Brewery—and wine.

During the event, FAV board members made an unexpected (though very welcome) announcement to guests and presented LRAV director Tracy Roark, with a check for \$100,000—a generous gift from an anonymous donor. Local media representatives from THV Channel 11, *Arkansas Times*, and the High Profile section of the *Democrat-Gazette* were in attendance to cover the announcement.

## Paint For Pets Events

Several local painting studios—including Spirited Art in Little Rock and Painting with a Twist in North Little Rock—host fundraising or “Painting with a Purpose” events for local nonprofits and charities to help increase awareness for their causes while enjoying a themed night of painting (and drinking!) fun. A portion of each painter's registration fee is donated to the organization on behalf of the studio.

Friends of the Animal Village has annually hosted a Paint For Pets Event for the past four years, adding two events to the 2014 calendar, including one in February at Spirited Art and one in November at Painting with a Twist. We hope you'll join us for our next event! Be ready to potentially get a little paint on your paws and definitely have a great time!

## Doggie Paddle Day

Although our annual Doggie Paddle Day event is only three years old, it is one of our most beloved and anticipated calendar items among people (and pups) in the community. This year's event was originally scheduled for October 19<sup>th</sup>, but was unexpectedly pushed back to November 2<sup>nd</sup> a couple weeks beforehand.

Doggie Paddle Day takes place at the Jim Dailey Fitness & Aquatic Center—a huge area with many different ways for dogs to play in the water and have a good time.

This year's Paddle Day was the largest yet, welcoming over 130 people and around 115 dogs. And it wasn't just the size that grew—there were two big firsts in 2014. One being that we hosted a Super Retriever Series-style amateur dock jump contest, and the other being that we offered \$10 micro-chipping at the event in partnership with Dr. Baeyens of the Baeyens-Hauk Veterinary Hospital and our good friends at All About Labs. An incredible 36 dogs were micro-chipped on the spot.

As always, Doggie Paddle Day attracted a good deal of local media attention, including THV Channel 11, *Arkansas Times*, and the *Democrat-Gazette*. In fact, our event emcee was Theva Lolley, a producer for THV who is also widely known as the momma of Joey the Garden Cat.

FAV board members presented LRAV director Tracy Roark, with a plaque honoring his 10 years of impeccable service to the city, as well as a \$10,000 check to go towards our “Joey's Play Room” fund (see page 8).

## A Word From FAV's President of the Board

Dear Friends & Supporters,

I once read, "Adoption of an animal is vital to our community and the care is even greater. Those of us who can must do our part to defeat the abuse and neglect of animals." In my opinion, no statement could be truer had I said it myself. As someone who has aspired to live up to my responsibility as a humanitarian, I have always believed that those who have much—be it strength, resources, intelligence, or wealth—have a moral responsibility to care and serve those less fortunate and in need. I also believe that obligation goes beyond just our fellow human beings to include all living animals that walk amongst us.

Looking back on our achievements since becoming a nonprofit organization in the fall of 2010, I'm reminded that everything we do through Friends of the Animal Village (FAV) is made possible by our generous supporters and devoted volunteers.

Each year, over 4,000 animals come through the doors of the Little Rock Animal Village (LRAV), our city shelter, in various stages of life and health. Many are strays who were abandoned or have lost their way, and others still have been rescued from horrible living conditions. There is no paid staff, including members of our Board of Directors, whom together as a group dedicate hundreds upon hundreds of hours each year coordinating fundraising events, hosting community awareness presentations, and assisting the Village with increasing the number of animals in Pulaski County that benefit from programs such as adoption, fostering, micro-chipping, spay/neuter, medical attention, training to thrive in his or her new home, etc.

We believe that every healthy and adoptable pet deserves a home of his or her own, and that there is a perfect pet for every person. We know that every loving, caring moment we provide to a pet's life, he or she returns it back ten-fold. ## Anonymous Donor Gives \$100,000 to FAV

*Press Release from February 2014 :: KARK*—An anonymous donor has made a \$100,000 gift to Friends of the Animal Village (FAV), an organization that provides supplemental support to the City's shelter, the Little Rock Animal Village (LRAV).

With this donation FAV kicks off a major fund-raising campaign for the LRAV that will allow supporters to sponsor and, in some cases, have naming rights on such things as veterinary equipment, kennels, and buildings.

FAV presented the \$100,000 check to the LRAV at the Little Rock Board of Directors on February 11th at 5 PM at Metroplan, 501 West Markham.



"This incredibly generous gift to Friends of the Animal Village has sparked a fire inside of everyone involved," said Kelsey White, Vice President of Friends of the Animal Village. "Dreams that we had for our city's shelter, the Little Rock Animal Village, and the animals in their care have become a reality virtually overnight, and this powerful momentum is perfect for kicking off FAV's new Sponsorship Program."

"The Little Rock Animal Village will see tremendous benefits from this substantial gift," said Little Rock City Manager Bruce T. Moore. "The City is deeply grateful to the donor and the Friends of the Animal Village board members that helped to secure the contribution. I look forward to seeing the remarkable and continued growth of the Animal Village's programs."

These funds will be used to kick start plans to build a facility to housedogs being evaluated to participate in the PetSmart Charities Rescue Waggin' program. LRAV is a shelter partner in the program that transfers selected dogs and puppies from partner shelters in areas like Little Rock where there are more dogs and puppies than can be placed through adoption. They are then transported to places where they get adopted, often within days.

At the LRAV, the program has been dependent on having enough foster homes to care for the animals waiting to go off on the Rescue Waggin'. This new building will allow LRAV to house more dogs waiting for a new home.

"We are stunned and so very thankful to this donor for their significant contribution to the Little Rock Animal Village," said Tracy Roark, director of the Animal Village. "The hard working volunteers on the FAV Board have gone above and beyond to promote our shelter and provide additional resources that will allow us to vastly expand our services."

In 2013, the LRAV had a record year with 1,623 adoptions. In addition 479 took a ride on the Rescue Waggin', 166 more went to Rescue Organizations and 343 returned to owners. A total of 2,611 animals found new homes or were returned to their owners.

Friends of the Animal Village is a volunteer organization founded in 2010 that provides supplemental support for the Little Rock Animal Village. The group accepts donations and organizes fundraisers for the shelter throughout the year in an effort to raise awareness about the LRAV, increase adoptions and improve the quality of life for animals housed there. FAV has donated more than \$20,000 to LRAV since 2010.

The process of constructing this new addition is currently underway. Architectural plans have been drawn, and they expect to break ground and begin construction soon. Construction will be complete by December 2015.
